Sunday of the Holy Genealogy

On this day, the Sunday before the Nativity of Christ, we have been enjoined by our holy and God-bearing Fathers to make commemoration of all them that from the beginning of time have been well-pleasing unto God, from Adam even unto Joseph the Betrothed of the Most Holy Theotokos, according to genealogy, as Luke the Evangelist hath recounted historically; and likewise for the Prophets and Prophetesses, especially of Daniel the Prophet and the three holy youths. It is also known as the Sunday of the Holy Genealogy. We remember the aforementioned names, those in the Old Testament who were related to Christ by blood, and those who spoke of His Birth as a man. In the Divine Liturgy, we shall read of Jesus Christ's lineage from the Gospel of Saint Matthew. In this way, the Church shows us that Christ truly became a man, taking on human nature. He was not a ghost, an apparition, a myth, a distant imagined god, or the abstract god of philosophers; such a god does not have a family tree. Our God is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. He has flesh and blood, human

ancestors—many of whom sinned greatly, but like David, also repented greatly. Yet, all of these righteous ones in every age had been well-pleasing to God because they loved Him. By taking on human nature, the Son of God became like us in all ways, in flesh and blood, in mind and soul, and in heart and will. He differed from us in only one way: He could not sin. Since we know that Christ's human nature remained sinless, He is also fully divine, and He shows us the way in which we can avoid sin, and so improve and transform our human nature.

<u>THE EPISTLE</u>

Blessed art Thou, O Lord, the God of our Fathers. For Thou art just in all that Thou hast done for us.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews. (11:9-10; 32-40)

Brethren, by faith Abraham sojourned in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God. And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, and put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, so that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated—of whom the world was not worthy—wandering over deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

THE GOSPEL

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (1:1-25)

The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. Abraham was the father of Isaac, and Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers, and Judah the father of Perez and Zerah by Tamar, and Perez the father of Hezron, and Hezron the father of Aram, and Aram the father of Amminadab, and Amminadab the father of Nahshon, and Nahshon the father of Salmon, and Salmon the father of Boaz by Rahab, and Boaz the father of Obed by Ruth, and Obed the father of Jesse, and Jesse the father of David the king. And David was the father of Solomon by the wife of Uriah, and Solomon the father of Rehoboam, and Rehoboam the father of Abijah, and Abijah the father of Asa, and Asa the father of Jehoshaphat, and Jehoshaphat the father of Joram, and Joram the father of Uzziah, and Uzziah the father of Jotham, and Jotham the father of Ahaz, and Ahaz the father of Hezekiah, and Hezekiah the father of Manasseh, and Manasseh the father of Amon, and Amon the father of Josiah, and Josiah the father of Jechoniah and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon. And after the deportation to Babylon: Jechoniah was the father of Shealtiel, and Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel, and Zerubbabel the father of Abiud, and Abiud the father of Eliakim, and Eliakim the father of Azor, and Azor the father of Zadok, and Zadok the father of Achim, and Achim the father of Eliud, and Eliud the father of Eleazar, and Eleazar the father of Matthan, and Matthan the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, Who is called Christ. So all the generations from Abraham to David were fourteen generations, and from David to the deportation to Babylon fourteen generations, and from the deportation to Babylon to the Christ were fourteen generations. Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child of the Holy Spirit; and her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. But as he considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a son, and you shall call His Name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and His Name shall be called Emmanuel" (which means, God with us). When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him; he took his wife, but knew her not until she had borne a son; and he called His Name Jesus.



The Order of St. Ignatius

This Sunday across the Archdiocese is The Order of St. Ignatius of Antioch Sunday. The Department of Communications is featuring stories about The Order's oldest and youngest members who are 102 and 8 years old. Please read these stories so you can become more familiar with this philanthropic organization and its generous members.

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 14, 2023: Meet Ignatius Wood, The Order's Youngest Member Dn. Peter Samore On Dec. 18, 2022, at Ss. Joachim and Anna Mission in Goldendale, Wash., the priest called out after the Divine Liturgy, "Where is Ignatius?"

Ignatius Wood replied, "I'm right here! I've been serving next to you all morning."

Fr. John Phelps then helped Ignatius read the oath of induction. That day, at age 7, he became the youngest member ever

of The Order of St. Ignatius of Antioch.

Ignatius told his friends that it feels special to be part of an organization named after his patron saint. He knew that the "God-bearer" was the third bishop of Antioch, and that as a young child, St. Ignatius sat on Christ's lap (Matt. 18). He also knew that lions devoured St. Ignatius.

"When I wanted to be a lion for All Saints Eve, I told people that the lions helped in his sainthood and martyrdom," Ignatius recalled.

When Ignatius is not serving with Fr. John at the altar, he is setting up coffee hour and visiting St. John the Forerunner Greek Orthodox Monastery in Goldendale.

His father, Bryan, read the first-century Fathers of the Church, especially delving into the epistles of St. Ignatius of Antioch, when he was first learning about the Faith.

"The very first Christians knew Christ and the apostles, so it's impossible to deny that through the writings of St. Ignatius we have an organized, rooted Church," Bryan said. "In St. Ignatius, I saw how the Church is supposed to work.

"The more I dove into Orthodoxy, the more I saw that St. Ignatius made Orthodoxy stick. The child who sat on Christ's lap - that's quite the endorsement!"

When Bryan's wife, Meika, became pregnant with their second child, they decided to name him Ignatius. Last year, in thanks to God and the intercessions of the hieromartyr, father and son decided to join The Order as a Knight and a Junior Knight. Bryan sponsors his son's membership for now.

"I loved to be there doing something with my son, doing

something meaningful with him in our church," Bryan said. "The more we saw about all the good that it does, we were convinced to join."

Of The Order's many outreaches, financial support for the clergy and for missions like theirs stands out. But above all, the Woods most appreciate scholarships for summer camps, which the Woods' oldest daughter received last year to attend Camp St. Mary of Egypt.

Ignatius and Bryan hope that more people join The Order, including youth, young adults and families. Bryan sees membership in The Order as a way to teach children about structure and giving more to their church with parents setting a good example.

In her very full life, Bea McPherson served in World War II as a Military Mapping Maiden, and as the chairwoman of the first Pro Football Hall of Fame Style Show in 1963. Last year, she delivered the toast at the 100th anniversary celebration of St. George Church of Canton, Ohio, her lifelong parish which she and her parents helped to found. Her life is chronicled on her website.

On Dec. 14, Mrs. McPherson will turn 102 years old. She holds the title as the oldest active member of The Order of St. Ignatius of Antioch.

"I was surprised!" Bea said when she learned the news. "I think there was someone else, 101, and they weren't sure if she

was up to date on her dues.'

Bea is up to date, having been a Dame of the philanthropic organization since 1977, one year after it was founded. Her brother, David Shaheen - a charter member and a Knight Commander and Archbishop Michael Shaheen – a childhood neighbor of Bea – encouraged her to join The Order. She did, with one aspect of its ministry closest to her heart.

"Over the years, I have focused my financial support in helping each of the parish preachers and their families," she said. Active and retired priests of the Archdiocese receive financial assistance from The Order of St. Ignatius for travel, retirement and more.

Bea has been generous with her time, talents and treasure all her life. One of nine children, she

grew up during the Great Depression selling magazines, working in a market, and operating an elevator at a store to help her family make ends meet.

She attended Kent State University where the course of her life changed. There, she met her husband, James W. "Bill" McPherson Jr. She also enlisted in the war effort with the Military Mapping Maidens, or "3Ms" for short. Young women like Bea were recruited during World War II for mapmaking jobs in the Army Map Service. Bea met the demand for current maps that could be distributed quickly to soldiers at the fronts. Her cartographic efforts included D-Day at Normandy and the Battle of the Bulge. Bea wasn't nervous about the work. "We simply went about doing our job based on what we

learned, working together as a team, with excellent supervisors," she said.

Two decades later, Bea chaired or co-chaired the Pro Football Hall of Fame Style Shows in 1963 and 1965. Tickets were just \$3.50 each. The events drew about 300 attendees in those days. Attendance has since grown tenfold.

"I met so many interesting and committed people who cared about our community and the newly opened Pro Football Hall of Fame," she recalled, "plus working with the spouses of football players as style show models was a unique feature of our event.'


But Mrs. McPherson's greatest love and commitment have been to her home parish.

"I am forever proud of the legacy of my family and numerous other families from the old country in starting this congregation in their new country," she said in her toast at St. George Church's centennial in May of 2022. "Here we have found solace, friendship, faith, and love - 100 years ago, down through the years, and to this day.

When St. George Church was remodeled in 2013, she donated all the cushions for the pews in memory of her husband. Her generosity didn't stop there.

My mother died a day before my birthday in 1986, so I always decorate the church with poinsettias at Christmastime," Bea

said. "My father died around Easter, so I always decorate the church with lilies at Eastertime."



She also loves being a member of The Order of St. Ignatius of Antioch. Her framed certificate of induction still hangs on her wall. She often encourages her family members to join.

"Joining The Order is yet another act of one's faith and commitment to the church," Bea said. "Getting involved at an early age

helps to foster lasting friendships with others who share the same goals, interests, and spiritual beliefs.

Being a member of The Order is another strong tie to the church I love. It reminds me to seek out opportunities where I can continue to serve the congregation, our preacher and church leaders, and the teachings of the Orthodox faith.'

"I hope one day I can meet Metropolitan Saba," she said. "It'll be a nice visit when he comes to Canton!"
