

**FIRST SUNDAY OF GREAT LENT (SUNDAY OF ORTHODOXY)**

VENERABLE-MARTYR EUDOKIA OF HELIOPOLIS; VENERABLE DOMNINA OF SYRIA;  
MARTYRS MARKELLOS AND ANTHONY OF PAMPHYLIA



On March 1 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Venerable-martyr Eudokia of Heliopolis; Venerable Domnina of Syria; and Martyrs Markellos and Anthony of Pamphylia. On this same day, the First Sunday of the Fast, we make remembrance of the restoration of the holy and venerable Icons, which took place through the ever-memorable Sovereigns of Constantinople, Michael and his mother, Theodora, during the patriarchate of Saint Methodios the Confessor. This restoration was accomplished in the year 843. Theodora's husband was an iconoclast. After his death, Theodora venerated an icon of the Theotokos in front of Patriarch Methodios. The other faithful in the church did the same, venerating all the icons, considering them to be representations of their original elements, not idols. Theodora prayed to God to forgive her husband during the first week of Great Lent; and on the First Sunday of the Fast, she led the way in hanging up the icons to adorn the churches.

## THE EPISTLE

*Blessed art Thou, O Lord, the God of our fathers. For Thou art just in all that Thou hast done for us.*

### **The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews. (11:24-26, 32-40)**

Brethren, by faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter; choosing rather to share ill-treatment with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season; esteeming the reproach of the Christ greater riches than the treasures of Egypt; for he looked to the recompense of reward. And what more shall I say? For the time would fail me if I tell of Gideon, Barak, Sampson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and all the prophets, who through faith subdued kingdoms, worked righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, from weakness were made strong, became mighty in war, and turned to flight armies of the aliens. Women received their dead by resurrection, and others were tortured, not accepting their deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection. And others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn asunder, they were tempted, they were slain with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, being destitute, afflicted, tormented (of whom the world was not worthy), wandering in deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, having obtained a witness through their faith, did not receive the promise, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

## THE GOSPEL

### **The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John. (1:43-51)**

At that time, Jesus decided to go to Galilee. And He found Philip and said to him, "Follow Me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael, and said to him, "We have found Him of Whom Moses in the Law and also the Prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." Jesus saw Nathanael coming to Him, and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile!" Nathanael said to Jesus, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathanael answered Him, "Rabbi, Thou art the Son of God! Thou art the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, I saw you under the fig tree, do you believe? You shall see greater things than these." And Jesus said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man."

## *About St. John's*

This is the next in a series of messages in the Weekly Bulletin about our new Fellowship Hall, and about our parish's history.

The St. John Daycare and Preschool is an important component in the history of our parish. Founded in the late 1980s, the program today is as important as ever. First and foremost, the excellent care children receive helps establish our parish as a key contributor in the Lamorinda community.

The idea of starting the preschool and daycare center was brought to the Parish Council by parishioners and visionaries Dr. Nabil and Erica Garas, and their two daughters, Dahlia and Lydia. Nabil was a scientist, and he and Erica also operated a successful preschool out of their home in Concord. They shared with the council information about the increasing importance of childcare, and offered to advise and guide the parish on what it would take to establish this type of facility. Once the council, and subsequently the whole parish, voted to move forward with the proposal, Erica and Nabil led parish volunteers in doing the labor needed to modify the first floor of our two-story building to accommodate preschool operations.

Over the years, our clergy and parishioners have stepped forward to serve as the Preschool Board. Working in conjunction with school's employees, the program has steadily grown and improved. Today, the program is fully accredited by both county and state governments. In addition to providing a safe environment and educational growth for its students, our preschool is one of the few offering its youngsters a hot and nourishing lunch every day.

As we reflect on this history, we remember and thank Erica, and her late husband, Nabil, and their family for stepping forward with an idea that enabled our parish to grow and flourish. Erica's calm and steady hand and Nabil's high energy and big personality enabled the parish to both serve the community-at-large and become more financially secure. Numerous parish programs, including the building fund, have been strengthened by these funds.

St. John has been blessed over the years with clergy and parishioners who have come forth with ideas that helped the parish grow. Who and what will be the next great idea that takes our parish to new heights? Is it possible that the new Fellowship Hall will unlock new opportunities? All ideas and initiatives are welcome, so step forward and share yours.

Happy New Year PLC Family!

We are so excited to kick off our 2026 Parish Life Conference in beautiful San Diego, CA, during the 250th anniversary of our great Nation! Thanks to all the wonderful feedback you've shared over the years, the CPCC has heard you and has made some meaningful changes to make the PLC more affordable this year and for the years to come. Below are some of the major changes that will be implemented:

- Due to the positive feedback from the 2025 PLC, **one full day** has been removed from the 2026 PLC and will remain that way for all future PLCs. This will create significant cost savings for our Clergy and their Parishes.

Thanks to the incredible room rate secured, the prime PLC location, and the holiday weekend, rooms are filling up earlier and at a higher rate than usual. We highly recommend booking your rooms early using the link below.

Additionally, there is **limited seating for our Saturday night event**, offering a front-row view of the San Diego Marina and the famous San Diego 4th of July firework show. Be sure to register and purchase your tickets as soon as possible to secure your spot.
