

SECOND SUNDAY OF GREAT LENT

COMMEMORATION OF GREGORY PALAMAS, ARCHBISHOP OF THESSALONICA

THEOPHYLACT THE CONFESSOR, BISHOP OF NICOMEDIA; APOSTLE HERMAS OF THE SEVENTY



On March 8 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate Theophylact the Confessor, bishop of Nicomedia; and Apostle Hermas of the Seventy. On this same day, the Second Sunday of the Fast, we make remembrance of our father among the saints, Gregory Palamas, archbishop of Thessalonica. This divine father was born in Asia and was brought up from infancy in the royal palace of Constantinople. When he was of age, Gregory left the palace and gave himself to asceticism on Mount Athos. He eventually moved to Thessalonica to seek cure for the diseases he contracted because of his asceticism and piety. In 1349, he was elevated to the episcopacy, tending to his people in an Apostolic fashion for 13 years. He is glorified as an ascetic, a hierarch, a theologian who defeated the heretics of his era, and a miracle-worker who forsook a prominent, secular lifestyle to take up his cross and follow Christ. The Most-Holy Theotokos, St. John the Theologian, St. Demetrius, St. Anthony the Great, St. John Chrysostom and angels of God appeared to him at different times.

THE EPISTLE

O Lord, save Thy people, and bless Thine inheritance.

Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord my God.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews. (1:10-2:3)

Thou, “O Lord, in the beginning didst lay the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the works of Thy hands; they will perish; but Thou remainest; and they will all grow old like a garment, and like a mantle Thou wilt roll them up, and they shall be changed; but Thou art the same, and Thy years will not fail.” But to which of the angels did He say at any time, “Sit on My right hand, until I make thine enemies a footstool for thy feet?” Are they not all spirits for liturgical ministry, sent forth to minister for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation? Therefore, we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things that were heard, lest at any time we drift away from them. For if the word spoken through angels was confirmed, and every transgression and disobedience received a just retribution, how shall we escape, if we neglect so great a salvation, which having at first been spoken through the Lord, was confirmed to us by those who heard?

THE GOSPEL

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark. (2:1-12)

At that time, when Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that He was at home. And many were gathered together, so that there was no longer room for them, not even about the door; and He was preaching the Word to them. And they came, bringing to Jesus a paralytic carried by four men. And when they could not get near Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above Him; and when they had made an opening, they let down the pallet on which the paralytic lay. And when Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven." Now, some of the scribes were sitting there, reasoning in their hearts, "Why does this man speak thus? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" And immediately Jesus, perceiving in His spirit that they thus reasoned within themselves, said to them, "Why do you reason thus in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your pallet and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" – He said to the paralytic – "I say to you, rise, take up your pallet and go home." And he rose, and immediately took up the pallet and went out before them all. So that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We never saw anything like this!"

This continuing series of Weekly Bulletin articles will feature topics related to the Fellowship Hall project, as well as St. John Church history.

With the realization of the dream for a Fellowship Hall, and the excitement of using the Hall for coffee hour, the December 6 Gala, the Crab Feed, and more activities to come, we continue to thank all those who contributed to the fund-raising drive and to all who worked on committees related to Hall construction.

During the design, permitting and construction phases of the project, four people from our parish led the way. As we thank Fr. Nicholas, Samar Adranly, Fuad Sweiss, and Steve Kreta for their leadership, there will be others mentioned in upcoming editions of this article series.

From the moment Fr. Nicholas was assigned to serve as our priest in 2012, he kept his focus on seeing the dream for Fellowship Hall at St. John's come true. During Parish Council Meetings, Annual Parish Meetings, Women's Auxiliary and Men's Fellowship meetings, and in informal conversations with parishioners, he "preached" how important it was for the parish to come together as a community to fulfill this goal.

Fuad and Samar, along with Fr. Nicholas, were involved in the initial design and permitting phase of the project, and Steve joined the team during the final design, permitting and throughout the construction steps. While Steve, Samar, and Fuad have varied professional careers, all three have practice and education in disciplines of engineering.

Steve as a Professional Mechanical Engineer, and Professor and Vice President at the California Maritime Academy, also oversaw construction of several new buildings on the Vallejo campus.

Samar is a Professional Structural Engineer, and Senior Vice President with Eichleay, a company, founded in 1875, specializing in the engineering and construction of projects throughout the world.

Fuad, as a Professional Civil Engineer, is an appointed Member of the California Architects Board, served as a City Engineer in San Francisco and Santa Ana, and is the founder of Petra Construction Company.

Over the many months of the construction process, Fr. Nicholas, Samar, Fuad, and Steve devoted an enormous number of hours and hard work to this project. Happy New Year PLC Family!

We are so excited to kick off our 2026 Parish Life Conference in beautiful San Diego, CA, during the 250th anniversary of our great Nation! Thanks to the incredible room rate secured, the prime PLC location, and the holiday weekend, rooms are filling up earlier and at a higher rate than usual. We highly recommend booking your rooms early using the link below.
